

TTT OID Assignment Rules

1. Applicant

Any natural or legal person can apply for an OID.

2. Entitlement of Assignment an OID or a specific OID

There is no entitlement, that an OID has to be assigned. There is no entitlement for getting a specific OID.

3. Liability

For the correctness of an assigned OID, no liability is given by TeleTrust Deutschland. TTT is also not responsible for the quality of the object for which an OID is assigned, and the indication and impact of possible patents related to the object.

4. Publication of OIDs

The list of assigned OIDs is public. The list contains for each entry the following information:

- OID name
- OID no
- OID description and link to applicant form
- Date of assignment
- Remarks

The list can be retrieved from the TTT server (www.teletrust.de).

5. Assignment Process

The TTT OID Registration Authority assigns an OID in close cooperation with the related TTT Working Group as soon as possible after having received a complete application form with all referenced documents.

6. Rejection of a Request for Assignment

Reasons for rejection of a request are e.g.

- the application form with all referenced documents is not complete
- the object of OID assignment is not sufficient described
- for the object exists already an OID assigned by any OID Registration Authority.

7. Usage Duration

There is no restriction with respect to usage duration of an OID, i.e. the usage duration of an OID is unlimited in principle.

However, due to attacks or other reasons the usage of certain OIDs may become obsolete. Those OIDs will be marked in the OID list with "Usage no longer recommended".
